Human trafficking is a form of abuse where people profit from the control and exploration of others. Victims are sold in the sex industry across the globe, often in hotel rooms and transported via airlines, commercial buses, and on trains. Trafficking takes place globally and within the United States.

What to Look Out For:

1. Minimal luggage/clothing

2. Lack of access to travel documents and money

- 3. Victim seems disoriented and lost
- 4. Victim lacks physical and verbal autonomy
- 5. Minimal eye contact with others

- 6. Trafficker insist on paying solely in cash
- 7. Trafficker is seen with young children
- 8. No evidence of a return ticket

9. Victim has indications of physical and emotional abuse

10. Trafficker/victim seems anxious to arrive to their destination

What to Do:

 Be alert during large gatherings such as conventions, airports and sporting games
Do not confront the child or adult

3. Alert management, flight attendant, or airport security

4. Note their room/seat number, names, and description of individuals
